## **GENERAL FORMAT SETUP**

- **Text alignment:** Justified
- **Line spacing:** 1.5-line spacing for the main body; single spacing for abstract, keywords, tables, and references
- Font: Times New Roman, 11-point
- Margins: 1 inch on top, bottom, left, and right
- Page size: A4
- **Headings:** Numbered (1, 2, 3...)
- Page numbering: Bottom-center, Times New Roman, 11-point
- **Diagrams and images:** Placed appropriately within the text
- **Abstract:** Single paragraph, 150–200 words
- **Keywords:** 3–6 keywords
- Word count: Less than 8000 words (excluding references and appendices)
- **Orientation:** Portrait only
- Referencing style: APA 7th edition
- **DOI URLs:** Must be included for each article whenever possible
- File format: Final submission must be in PDF format

## **TITLE AND AUTHOR DETAILS**

- Title: Centered, bold, Times New Roman, 14-point
- **Author names and affiliations:** Centered below the title, with space between each author's information, Times New Roman, 12 –point
- Corresponding author's email: Only include the email of the corresponding author

#### **ABSTRACT AND KEYWORDS**

- **Abstract:** Maximum 200 words, Centered, Italic, Times New Roman, 11 -point, no indentation
- **Keywords:** Italic, 11-point, no indentation, placed immediately after the abstract

## **HEADINGS FORMAT**

## **First-Level Heading**

• Bold, Times New Roman, 12-point, numbered, left-justified, with one-line space above and below

## **Second-Level Heading**

 Bold, Times New Roman, 11-point, numbered, left-justified, with one-line space above and below

## **Third-Level Heading**

• Bold, italic, Times New Roman, 11-point, numbered, left-justified, with one-line space above and below

## **TABLES AND FIGURES**

- Each table and figure must be numbered sequentially and left-justified
- Table and figure titles must be left-justified, Times New Roman, 11-point,
- Excessive tables, figures, and raw data should be avoided; if necessary, they should be included in an appendix
- Tables, charts, and all images will be printed in black and white only. Authors should ensure that color images are suitable for grayscale printing.
- Captions must include the corresponding number from the main text citation.
- If the figure or table is not your own, you should obtain written permission to use it.
- Captions must include the copyright holder's details and state that permission to reproduce has been obtained.
- Acceptable file formats: JPG, PNG, EPS, TIFF.
- Acceptable figure quality: 1200 dpi or higher.

## **EQUATIONS**

- Equations should be left justified.
- The equation number should appear in parentheses and be right-aligned

## **Example:**

## **FOOTNOTES AND APPENDIX**

- Do not use endnotes. If necessary, use footnotes instead. The footnote text should be single-spaced and in Times New Roman, 10-point.
- Appendix: If an appendix is included, it must appear after the References section.

• Every citation must follow **APA 7th edition** style


